Dear FPC Family,

Grace to you and peace from God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit! I pray that in these challenging days you are drawing hope from the very source of our security and provision – the Lord Jesus.

We can take heart knowing that God is our refuge and strength (Ps. 46:1). Even when we have trouble in this world, we are promised peace because Jesus has overcome the world (John 16:33). Nothing can separate us from the love of Christ Jesus (Rom. 8:39) -- not cratering oil prices, not the Coronavirus, not social distancing "... nothing in all creation," says the Apostle Paul. It's April Fool's Day, perhaps we can at least "smile" into the notion that we are to be "fools for Christ sake" and trust Him with our whole heart.

I write today to share an update. We are approaching Holy Week. Given the current events, we decided to move our Holy Week services online as we recognize the continuing efforts to avoid spreading Covid-19. At minimum, we can better understand the worship experience of Christians in other places who cannot gather corporately on a regular basis.

*For Palm Sunday, please plan on stopping by the church on Friday, April 3 or Saturday, April 4 to pick up some palm branches that your family can use in worship together Sunday. The branches will be in buckets outside the main entrance on Texas Street.

Perhaps a few lines from Ann Weems poem from <u>Kneeling in Jerusalem</u> may help orient us toward Holy Week:

Holy is the week. . . Holy, consecrated, belonging to God . . . We move from hosannas to horror with the predictable ease of those who know not what they do.

Our hosannas to sing, our palms to wave, let us go with passion into this week . . .

I do look forward to the time when we can, once again, be together in worship and service! In the meantime, . . . may the love of God surround you, the grace of Christ attend you, and the Holy Spirit keep you!
