These are interesting times, to say the least! And we're grateful for your patience and understanding as we learn how to be the church in uncharted territory.

From now through Monday, March 30, all of our staff will begin working from home.

Please continue to call the church (432.684.7821) with any prayer needs, concerns, or questions. We will not have someone answering the phone, but just leave a message and the message will promptly be forwarded to the relevant person. You are also welcome to email any <u>staff person</u> directly. We are continuing to work during this time, so don't hesitate to reach out.

From now through Monday, March 30, all ministry meetings, outside groups, and gatherings will be canceled or moved online. Please assume if you have something that was scheduled at the church during this time, alternative arrangements need to be made. Contact any group leader for details about plans. Worship services on both March 22 and 29 will occur online.

During these uncertain times, please remember we still depend on your tithes and contributions to operate. Especially as our community faces an economic downturn at the same time as this virus, we are aware there will be many needs we may have the opportunity to meet in the weeks ahead and we need your faithful support to be able to respond. As we all know, the situation in our country seems to be changing by the day -- if not the moment. **These are our current plans for now, but some of these plans may be extended depending on current developments.** You will always find the most current information on our website's <u>Covid-19 update page</u>. Also, we'll do a lot of communicating via <u>Facebook</u> and <u>Instagram</u>. We know social media isn't for everyone (and too much isn't good for any of us in times like these) -- but it is a helpful connection, so be sure to find us there too!

While our face-to-face interactions may be momentarily suspended, we will still be the church. Nothing can stop that. Here's how that looks in specific ministry areas:

Worship + Prayer

For the next two Sundays (March 22 and 29) our worship will be <u>online at 11:00 Sunday morning</u>. You can also listen to the radio broadcast at KMCM-97Gold (96.9 FM). Future dates will be determined based on current events. We'll share worship resources for both adults and children on that page before Sunday as well. During this time, homebound communion will be suspended out of our desire

to protect our elderly.

Other currently cancelled events include: March 18 and 25 Come to the Quiet, the March 22 Sunday Evening Prayer Service, Children's Choirs, Sanctuary Choir and Agape Ringers. The Children's Choir Musical will be postponed; date to be determined!

Congregational Care

Our pastoral staff is still available and committed to pastoral care in these times. Please email <u>Pastor</u> <u>Charles</u> or our congregational care coordinator <u>Becky Holmes</u>. You can also call the church (432.684.7821) with any needs for care you may encounter and our pastors will reach out as soon as possible. We will be especially diligent in reaching out to those who may feel particularly isolated- our homebound covenant partners, the hospitalized, those in recovery, and the grieving. Please know that in the midst of anxiety, fears, hurts, and stress, our church is here for you. You are not alone.

If you or someone you know is hospitalized, please let <u>Pastor Charles</u> know. We will reach out by phone whenever possible but can currently still visit the hospital in emergencies.

We hope our Road to Recovery program can resume on April I.

Outreach

Currently, our primary focus is partnering with West Texas Food Bank and MISD to help provide meals for food-insecure students at De Zavala Elementary and Midland High School. We may also be serving as a WTFB conduit for other community groups and churches in their efforts to provide the same support to other campuses. There are also opportunities to volunteer directly with the WTFB and Meals on Wheels to help support our most at-risk populations. Please see the <u>March 16 update</u> for more details about those needs.

Middle School + High School Ministries

We will be moving online to Instagram, Facebook, Vimeo with a weekly video featuring Grace and Nicole, and a semi-weekly bulletin via e-mail for parents focused on 'Table Talk' -- curriculum that we will be going through together paired with conversation starters, questions, and 'tips of the day' that will suggest healthy ways to spend time during social distancing.
